We also held 7 events that included Mother's Day and Father's Day raffles, Easter and Thanksgiving and we are looking to further strengthen our impact in the year ahead. We are grateful to be able to support our community, to provide tangible contribution to people's lives and reduce negative impacts lack of socioeconomic security has on families and individuals.", says Beverley Dwyer, founder of The Second Chance Foundation.
